9:30 – 10:00: Registration and Welcome

I. 10:00 – 11:00: Chelsea Misquith, Emerging Technologies Librarian at IUPUI, conducts outreach for the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NNLM). PubMed Presentation and Demo:

PubMed is a free database (not always free content), with coverage back to 1946 (and earlier), with both MedLine and non-Medline content. There are approximately 28,000 MeSH subject terms. Recent articles may not have MeSH, search by keyword can be helpful. Some features include: "Search Details" (how PubMed interprets your search terms), PubMedID, search MeSH (see hierarchy of terms, e.g. Advil), "Restrict to MeSH Major Topic," and article type (e.g. dataset, legal cases).

II. 11:00-12:00: S. Chandler Lighty, Executive Director, Indiana Archives and Records Admin.

About the Archives: The archives include physical items, records management and retention (keep about 5% of all IN records), an image and microfilming lab with land records, birth, death, marriage, supreme court, military, INDOT, IDEM and more. They have 310,000 boxes, which equals 75 miles. 150 participants crowd source WWI records. They apply the 70 year rule for prison/hospital records. Some cataloging is at the series level. Volunteer time, which equals over 3 full time employees. They have a total of 30 paid employees, 7 of which are archivists. **Mission and goals:** to collaborate with state agencies; fulfill statutory mandates; promote engaged citizenry, critical thinking and economic development. He intends to address pay levels of employees, make connections with the INDIGO members suggested that we hold a future INDIGO meeting at the Indiana State Archives.

1:30 – 3:00 Business Meeting

1. Minutes: Spring 2018 Meeting Minutes were approved with 2 minor changes, 1) fix the link to the bylaws document, 2) clarify that the Education Committee is an ongoing committee, with the Education Committee Chair serving as a member of the INDIGO Board.

2. Committee Reports

- **Secretary/Treasurer** (Ann Marshall): INDIGO's balance at the beginning of January 2018 was \$3,004.09. As of October 31, INDIGO's balance was \$2,919.25
- **Communications Committee** (Scott Sandberg): invited feedback about the new INDIGO Google site at <https://sites.google.com/site/ingovdocs/>. He is working on getting the webinars archived and will add links to the minutes and agendas available in Box. Ann Marshall and James Rodgers were added to Communication Committee (Andrea moved, Brent second, unanimously approved).
- **Federal Committee** (Brent Abercrombie): Brent's site visits included Purdue University (WL) with Bert, Indiana University Bloomington with Emily. GPO will visit Indiana, including Evansville and Bloomington. Indiana will lose Valparaiso Law Library as a selective depository because the law library has closed.
- **State Committee** (Lou Malcomb): Lou sends feedback to HathiTrust (via their form) about Indiana docs that have limited instead of full access. She has had some success with this effort, but not comprehensive success.

3. Ad Hoc Committee Reports

- **Archives Committee** (Emily Alford): the INDIGO archives live at the Indiana State Library (with a signed deed of gift). Emily will invite a new volunteer to lead this committee via the INDIGO listserv. Scott will find out if there is digital archiving for the Google INDIGO site.
- **Education & Outreach Committee** (Andrea Morrison): Scott Sandberg presented for the first INDIGO webinar (<https://bit.ly/2TIYj0C>). Kim Mattioli was the second presenter (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=eE-68d_ScMA). A formal letter of thanks from INDIGO will be sent (proposed, seconded and passed unanimously). Attendees get LEUs for the 45 min (plus question time) webinars. Proposed upcoming webinars include one on the census (by Katie Springer) and Pacer (by Jennifer Morgan).
- **Bylaws Committee** (Andrea Morrison): the work on the bylaws is ongoing.
- **GID Day 2020** (Brent Abercrombie): A committee will be set up at the spring meeting and an invitation to the listserv will be distributed. Brent will serve as Chair. Meetings are once a month for an hour by teleconference. Should the event be moved from May to January (ALA Midwinter 2021 is in Indy)? There's an interest in branching out to libraries in neighboring states.
- **Informal Survey on Association Involvement** (Lou Malcolm): Survey findings suggest that not as many people read journals regularly (Gov Info. Quarterly is an example); people like conferences, as well as listservs and social media. A new question will be sent out: What would inspire you to participate in GODORT and in INDIGO?

4. New Business: Welcome and congratulations to Emily Alford as our new INDIGO Chair.

5. Round Table Reports from Attendees

- **Diane Calvin:** Ball State migrated to Alma/Primo; there were issues with inactive URLs with born digital documents (not just for gov docs). The change also meant losing the ability to limit to gov docs.

- **Ann Marshall**, Purdue Fort Wayne: with the help of Visiting Librarian Muffy Schmidt, is working on twenty boxes of local gov docs. The first step is an inventory of the boxes.
- **Bert Chapman**: Purdue University (WL) is hiring a new Library Dean. Bert is working on the page proofs for his book (<https://bit.ly/2Pk4S2s>). He presented the 4th in a series of FDLP webinars, Enhancing Your Intelligence Agency Information Resources (<https://bit.ly/2Py8RLU>).
- **Caroline Gilson**: On Monday Nov. 26, DePauw will host a celebration of the Mars Insight landing (<https://mars.nasa.gov/insight/>), with live NASA streaming. They are also re-homing their serial set.
- **Katie Springer**, State Data Center: is conducting 2020 Census outreach and education. Complete Count Committees will help facilitate the count. See also: <https://www.inphilanthropy.org/Census2020>. In 2020, you will receive a postcard and then can fill out the census online (i.e. the 10 basic questions). Online promotional materials haven't been released yet.
- **Andrea Glenn**, State Docs at Indiana State Library: is the Chair of their Exhibits Committee, which has developed exhibits on the Practice of Medicine, Business of Death, History of the State House and others.
- **James Rogers**, IU Kokomo: has been a Gov Docs librarian since May and is getting up to speed with the “firehose of information.” He participated in the FDLP Certificate Program and created new signage with federal agency info.
- **Andrea Morrison**: is working on the cataloging of local gov docs. Best practices have not always been followed. She is also working on GODORT Cataloging Libguides. Congratulations on the arrival of her first grandchild!
- **Rena Seidler**: Check out the IU McKinney Law School’s new furniture. Rena just returned from being out of the office and passed along her regrets for not being available during her absence.
- **Brent Abercrombie**, Indiana State Library: has found new homes for the state-based “Archives of the State of ...” Also many congratulations to Brent for recently getting married and for expecting the birth of a baby daughter.
- **Jennifer Morgan**: is teaching two classes. Several of Jennifer and Andrea’s students will be published in DTTP. IU Jerome Hall Law Library is hiring a faculty services librarian. A possible purchase of Supreme Court insight (ProQuest) is being considered for the Library.
- **Emily Alford**: IU Bloomington, participated in the Big 10 Voting Challenge, a competitive effort to get out the vote. There is a New Center for Rural Engagement at IU Bloomington and the IU Bicentennial is coming up. She is running for GODORT Secretary, vote for her! She is incoming Chair, watch for opportunities for field trips.
